

CPRE Sussex Hedgerow Hike

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What is the Hedgerow Hike?

The Hedgerow Hike is a sponsored walk and can be done by individuals, families and groups at any time during September 2021. It is not a single event; you have the flexibility to do any length of walk at any time during the month.

It has three aims:

- To raise funds for CPRE Sussex
- To celebrate hedgerows
- To promote wellbeing

2. When is it taking place?

Throughout September 2021, but you can start gathering sponsorship for your Hedgerow Hike from the 1 July.

3. In what ways can I take part?

You can ask your family and friends to sponsor you per mile or per walk, or per 1,000 steps – it's up to you. You may like to suggest a sponsorship level such as £1 per mile or £30 for an all-day week, or £50 for a daily walk each day in September. It is entirely up to you.

4. How do I raise sponsorship money?

There are several ways to do this, to make it as easy as possible for everyone:

7. How far do I have to walk?

You really can walk as little or as far as you like – for example, round your garden, your local park, your local streets, following a nature walk, taking part in an organised walk in the High Weald or South Downs, walking part or all of the South Downs Way.

8. Can I use other means of travel?

If you are unable to walk, please consider other ways you can enjoy the Sussex landscape and hedgerows, while raising money for CPRE Sussex.

9. What will the money be spent on?
