This year's celebration of the Sussex countryside will be held at the Seven Sisters Country Park.

A free celebration of the countryside is returning to Sussex in a fantastic new location.

This year's CPRE Sussex Countryside Day will be held at the stunning Seven Sisters Country Park on Sunday, 6 September.

CPRE Sussex campaigns and communications manager Nancy Duckels said: "We are absolutely delighted that this year's Countryside Day will be held at one of our county's most iconic sites. The Seven Sisters Country Park is home to globally-important habitats and unique wildlife making it the perfect place to host our annual celebration of the countryside. We hope everyone will come along for crafts, walks, talks and a slice of birthday cake as the national CPRE charity celebrates its 100th birthday."

From 10am to 3pm visitors can head to the Pump Barn for a range of family-friendly, nature-themed craft activities. Activities will include summer lantern making, clay creature creation and fabric printing using foraged leaves.

There will also be interactive sessions focused on protecting the Sussex countryside.

From 3pm to 4pm a Centenary Celebration Talk will reflect on 100 years of countryside protection – and what comes next.

Guided walks exploring the nature and history of the Seven Sisters will start at 10.30am, 11.30am and 2pm. Walks are £4 or £2 for CPRE Sussex members.

The Countryside Day is on from 10am to 4pm at Seven Sisters Visitors Centre, Exceat, Seaford, on Sunday, 6 September. Entry is free but please [register in advance here](#).
